On Monday, our children took part in an important and engaging Water Safety Assembly led by Essex Fire and Rescue. With the warmer weather approaching and families spending more time near rivers, lakes, and the coast, the timing couldn't have been better. The assembly focused on how to stay safe in and around water, what to do in an emergency, and how to spot dangers before they become serious. One key takeaway for the children was the simple but powerful message: "Respect the water." They learned what to do if they or someone else falls in, including the crucial steps of staying calm, floating on your back, and calling for help. A huge thank you to the Essex Fire and Rescue team for delivering such an informative and potentially life-saving session. We're proud that our pupils are now better equipped to enjoy the outdoors safely and responsibly.

Our football team were also in action against Lawford Mead they showed outstanding skill and team work and won 2-1! Great result - well done team and our coach, Mr Smith.

Huge congratulations to our brilliant netball team who won the Chelmsford Netball Finals on Tuesday! The team played with skill, determination, and fantastic team spirit throughout the tournament, securing a well-deserved victory. This week, we were pleased to welcome the Maldon First Aid Roadshow back into school for our Year 6 pupils. The session combined visual presentations, videos, and hands-on activities to deliver an engaging and informative first aid experience. Pupils learned how to approach an emergency scene, assess a casualty, and contact the emergency services. They also practised placing someone in the recovery position and gained an understanding of the respiratory and circulatory systems. Using specialist equipment, they were taught how to administer CPR and learned about defibrillators and how to access them in an emergency. It was a valuable and immersive learning opportunity—thank you to Maldon First Aid for an excellent session.

With SATs now in their wake, Year 6 haven't wasted a moment and have been very excited about auditioning for their summer production, Pirates of the Currybean - we can't wait to see it.
