Learning Opportunities at Home - Homework Policy

Homework is an important part of the home-school partnership and is encouraged in a supportive and positive way. It helps children develop independence, personal motivation, and lifelong learning skills. Tasks may include practical activities, research and investigations. All children are expected to read at home every day. In addition, they will usually be given maths activities and spellings to practise regularly.

Homework expectations will be shared with parents at the beginning of the school year and will increase progressively as children move through the school. Class teachers will provide specific guidance for their year group each September. In Upper School, particularly in Year 6, homework may become more formal to support preparation for secondary school.

The school recognises the value of out-of-school clubs organised by parents, as well as the importance of children having free time to relax and pursue their own interests after school. We actively encourage a healthy balance between structured activities and downtime.
